standard. Motivated by the learning environment of the family he started through preparation of the examination when he was in class 8. "It is important that you prepare well for the exam. I heard about IIT when I was in class 8 and started preparing for the exams since then", asserted Siddharth, sitting beside his mother Anjuben Patel on a swing with a cool and confident smile on the face.

To ensure that no stone is left unturned, Siddharth joined Resonance training institute at Kota. It was the vacation period which he utilized exclusively for the IIT training. "There is a high level of competitive environment and on-hand training which boosts one to clear the exam. It helps in making the concepts clear which is essential to get the exam clear."

Approximately 5,50,000 students across the nation appeared at the IIT entrance exam to confirm admission in over 9000 seats available in 15 IITs across India.

Siddharth studied 10 hours per day. He never expected to be the state topper but was sure that he would make it in top

100. The glorious success story has not been just one dimensional effort. His parents guided him and provide with all support to hit the bull's eye their son was aiming at.

"I understand importance of education deeply. We always gave due concentration on the progress of Siddharth's work. He cleared his class 10 when he was in class 9 and in class 11 he completed the entire syllabus of class 12. He completed his Mathematics paper in just one hour in class 10. He has excellent grasping power", says the proud mother.

in Rajkot. Due to his poor financial condition he left studies during his high school years. At the age of 17 he was married to Vijyagori.

At that time he was independently not earning enough, so he joined his father's dairy business in Rajkot. Due to his art loving nature, Mehta neither paid attention to his father's business nor to study. He even got Government job in Public Works Department, but he rejected that too. Finally he found his dream job of writing plays in Mumbai, so he settled there afterwards.

Ramesh Mehta struggled much in his early life. During one of his interview he mentioned that, he failed to gift a single sari to his wife in first two decades of marriage. He did not give proper



education to his children even. He wanted to achieve something in his life, so he had no lament for what he had sacrificed.

Ramesh Mehta portrayed worldly as a good humorist but he actually was a versatile personality. He started his filmy career as a drama artist. He was a good writer too, he wrote scripts of dramas like 'Pritamlal na Pagle', 'Soodi Vacche Sopari', 'Hu Ano Var'. He wrote film

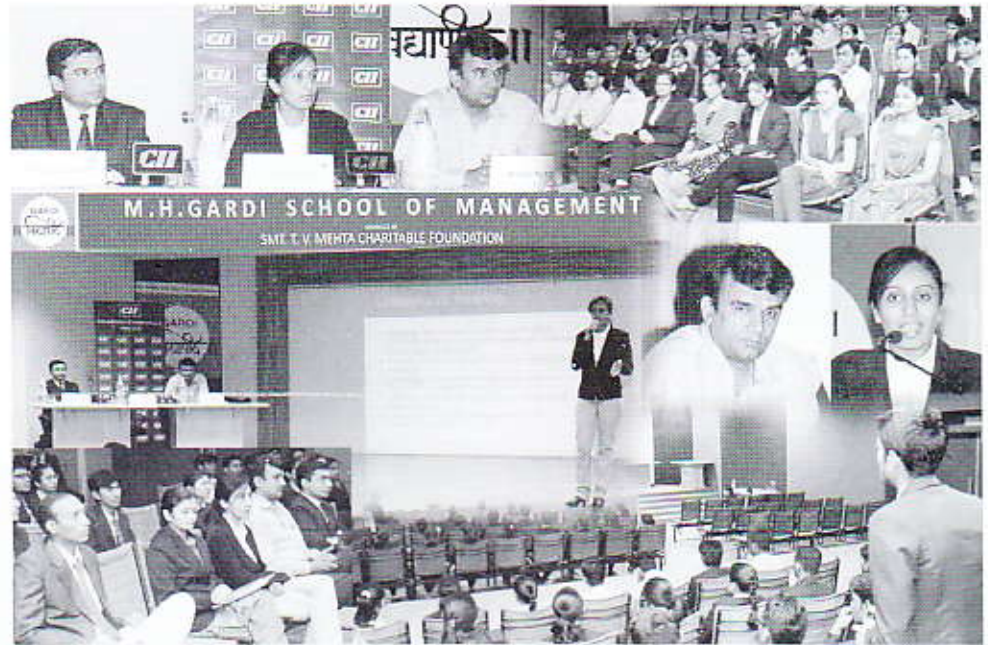
Effective Listening Skill

MH Gardi School of Management & C. C. Gardi Institute of Management, Gardi Vidyapith, one of the prominent institutes of Saurashtra region on 27th April, in association with Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) arranged the workshop for the students of Management "Effective Listening Skills".

Almost 100 students and eight faculties participated at the workshop of CII. CII Rajkot zone has been doing various activities like, training industrial people, workshop to improve their skills, Faculty Development Programs, Interactive Session Seminar, Buyer-Seller Meets and Student Development Programs & Industry-academia Collaboration Learning Programs.

After having a warm welcome of dignitaries, Mr. Jayesh Parekh, Coordinator, CII & Ms. Vaishali Parekh, CEO, Krish Consultancy, the session started with a brief introduction of CII and achievements over a period of time.

Ms. Vaishali Parekh started her session with a famous quote "When you talk, you are only repeating what you already know, but if you listen, then you may learn something new." She mentioned the difference between effective listening. Narrating few facts, she said, an individual person can hear 125 - 250 wpm and can thing 1000 - 3000 wpm out of this only 2%



of people have had formal education with listening. Explaining the difference between listening and hearing, she said that hearing is passive while listening is an active activity. The four stems of listening includes hearing, interpretation, evaluation and response or action.

Students also got knowledge for reasons of poor listening like lack of effort, message overload, rapid thought, psychological noise, physical noise, hearing problems and faulty assumptions. She shared live example of excessive usage of face book.

Vaishali put pressure of four personal listening styles like content oriented listening, people oriented listening, action oriented listening and time oriented listening. With her concluding remarks she said that "Effective listeners remember that words have not meaning people have meaning".

The chairman of Gardi Vidyapith, Shri D. V. Mehta highlighted on the X-Factor and stated that an individual should have unique skills to outperform in this era. Mr. Prashant Mehta, CEO also emphasized on active listening instead of being a passive listener.

The Alan Turing Year 2012 marks the celebration of the life and scientific influence of Alan

Turing on the occasion of the centenary of his birth on 23 June 1912. Turing had an important influence on computing, computer science, artificial intelligence, developmental biology, and the mathematical theory of computability and made important contributions to code-breaking during the Second World War.

The international impact of Turing's work is reflected in the growing list of countries planning Alan Turing Year celebrations, including: Brazil, Canada, China, Czech Republic, France, Germany, India, Israel, Italy, Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Philippines, Portugal, Spain, Switzerland, U.K. and the U.S.A.

Alan Mathison Turing (23 June 1912 - 7 June 1954), was an English Mathematician, logician, cryptanalyst, and computer scientist. He was highly influential in the development of computer science, providing a formalisation of the concepts of "algorithm" and "computation" with the Turing machine, which played a significant role in the creation of the modern computer. Turing is widely considered to be the father of computer science and artificial intelligence.
