"FDI in retail sector is not a new thing. Wal Mart are functioning already in the name of "Easy Day".

To cop up with the financial deficit of 5.1%, the only option left with the government is allowing the flow of foreign companies.

It will take time become the Indian consumer behavior is different and the infra structural facilities are also different here. So small retailers need not worry or feel threatened. This FDI is allowed only in 53 major cities of India where the population is more than 10 lakhs. But it is

"India has large number of retailers. In this situation, it is not right to take away their jobs and give it to the foreigners.

The promises of huge job creation are baseless. The unemployment caused by the entries of such giants will be huge.

Under WTO regulations, the foreign companies will be free to import cheap labor from other countries. This will only create further unemployment.

Sure, tax revenue will increase. But these



retailers will not hesitate to serve hazardous products to our people. Corruption prevailing in India will help them."

"The government was very keen to introduce FDI in retail for so long but they were stopped by other parties. According to me, this is not the way to control inflation. Moreover, the overhead expenses of these retail stores will be very high. They will require minimum of 1 lakh sq. feet of space, huge infrastructure that is not available in India right now.

Initially, local traders may suffer. But eventually they will find their ways.

Government Taxes will increase obviously, because these retail stores will be more organized than small retailers.

There will not be any huge impact on overall employment. Moreover, many

people think that it is in competition with the local retailers. I tell you, this is a wrong perception. Actually when mall culture started, we had the same perception. But still our retailers survived.

From these retailers, small retailers should learn the marketing and displaying techniques rather than being afraid of them."

- The Republic of India can confer a maximum of three Bharat Ratna awards per year.
- The Prime Minister makes the recommendations for Bharat Ratna to the President of India.
- Bharat Ratna does not carry any monetary grant.
- The recipient of Bharat Ratna Award receives a medallion and a certificate signed by the President of India.
- The recipient of the award cannot use Bharat Ratna as a prefix or suffix to his/her name.

execution. Mothers were not ready to experiment with their child.

When nestle found that nutritional needs of people in semiurban areas were lacking, it struck upon the insight that affordable meals for large numbers of consumers in India don't provide all the relevant nutrients. The idea of providing a low cost meal with nutritional value results in Maggi products. This experience highlight that idea generation may sound simple but unless it is based on strong consumer insight and knowledge it likely to be failed.

Finally, innovation will succeed only when we have the expertise to make them.
